We Need the 858 Buses

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There are many buses in San Diego. Many people get on the 858 bus which they use to go to Grossmont College. My roommate also goes to Cuyamaca College by 858 every Monday to Friday. The 858 is sometimes trouble for college students because the 858 is not running on Saturday and Sunday. If the bus routes change, we will be able to go to College by the 115 buses. We understand that the 115 can go to SDSU and Downtown. We understand that we can go to Grossmont College on Saturday and Sunday by 115. However, the 115 presents problems for College Students because of three reasons. Everyone is not enjoyable for three reasons.

First, the 115 does not go to Johnson and Madison. On Madison Ave, there are two apartment complexes that many Grossmont College students and Cuyamaca College students live in. If the 858 does not show up, they have to walk for twenty minutes to the bus stop. This is the same as when they go back home. They have to get off the bus at Arnel Ave, and they have to walk for twenty minutes. Everyone knows college students are so busy. Some students study till ten o'clock at night, so they have to walk on the dark road for twenty minutes. Men might be safe, but there are many female students in the apartments. The streets are so dangerous for them. Recently, an incident happened in which two people were killed near the bus stop. Everyone feels the bus routes change is not comfortable and enjoyable, especially for girls. This change does not consider about person like female students. The change is not beneficial and not a supportive service for the college students. Second, Some Grossmont College students often go to Parkway Plaza by 858. The 858 buses makes it easy to go to the shopping mall. Many students want to go to Parkway Plaza from Grossmont College because Grossmont College cafeteria has few food choices. They sometimes want to go to the food court at the shopping mall. They want to eat meat or rice. If the bus route changes, the college students can't go to Parkway Plaza easily because the115 buses will not go to the shopping center. This change is not good for Wal-Mart and Parkway Plaza economically. This change is not considered very well.

Third, everyone that has waited for the bus before feels that the 115 buses come too late. We already use the 115 from SDSU, but our experience and attitude about the115 is so terrible because we often have to wait forty minutes or fifty minutes at SDSU. The 115 do not follow a bus schedule, so everyone is angry at SDSU. We can imagine that we have to wait for the115 at Groosmont College. In contrast, 858is come on time, so we worry about the 115 is coming on time.

In short, the 858 are necessary for Grossmont College students. Everyone feels the change in schedule is not comfortable, convenient, and enjoyable. It is not convenient for Johnson and Madison. We want to go to Parkway Plaza. We already know the115 are come on late. Finally, we still need 858 buses.

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DC Comments Re: MTS Route Proposals 3/8/06

- Grossmont College is consistently among the top community colleges in facilitating students' transfer to San Diego State University and more than 60% of San Diego State University's graduates first attended a community college.
- Who is to benefit from public transportation? Given these data, MTS has an opportunity to influence long-term public transit use, as it relates to the future of our communities, by being more accessible, not less, to community college students.
- Whatever is decided, the importance of stability of route scheduling cannot be overstated. Not only will our students' transportation planning depend on it, but our plans for interfacing our class schedules with bus arrival and departure times will be well served by such stability.
- We are concerned about any students who prefer or need to ride the bus, either because they are economically disadvantaged or have a physical disability. Currently, 5000 Grossmont College students each semester qualify for State subsidies or enrollment fee waivers each semester due to low income. Additionally, over 100 students each semester have physical disabilities that, either due to blindness or confinement to wheel chairs, must rely upon alternate means of transportation.
- As many students and surrounding residents know, Grossmont College suffers from the lack of parking available on campus. This has been the case for a number of years. Particularly now, with facilities construction either permanently or temporarily reclaiming areas previously committed to parking, this problem is even more intense. We are taking steps with our local bond measure resources to alleviate the parking problem through constructing a parking structure or purchase of new land upon which ground parking may be provided. However, we are also making an effort to encourage public transportation as a means

Dear Chairman Mathis and MTS Board of Directors:

The students, faculty and staff at Cuyamaca College would like to thank you for the opportunity to express our concerns regarding the proposed changes to the MTS schedule. Our primary concern has to do with providing access to the current and future students of Cuyamaca College, especially the disabled and low income populations that rely on public transportation to access public education.

On March 6th, we had a very productive meeting with MTS Associate Transportation Planner, Devin Braun, who helped us understand the proposed changes. It was an excellent meeting where we formalized our collaborative relationship with MTS and committed to meeting on a quarterly basis. We both came to a better understanding of our similar issues and how a collaborative relationship can benefit us all. We understand that you need a certain level of rider ship to provide effective and efficient services. We have a better understanding of how our being proactive and promoting MTS will assist you with your goals, and will help ensure that MTS services are available to the students that wish to access the opportunities at our college.

We have studied the new proposed changes made available to us via the Comprehensive Operational Analysis and would like to make a few recommendations for modifications to your plan. We request that you consider two modifications to your proposed changes. We would like to request that you extend route 962 to Cuyamaca College, rather than having the route end at Rancho San Diego Village (which is about a mile and a half from the college). This would be a minor change to your proposal and would prevent students from having to transfer to reach the college, when they are only a mile or so away. Secondly, we request that Saturday routes on the 816 bus <u>NOT</u> be eliminated. Approximately 15% of our enrollment includes students taking Saturday classes. We suggest that the route be reinstated on Saturdays with a reduced schedule. Currently the bus runs from 6:30 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. (I believe on both Saturday and Sunday). Most of our Saturday classes meet between 8:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m.; therefore if the route was reinstated, with a reduced schedule, from 7:30 - 3:30 and Sundays were eliminated, we feel that our students would be served and MTS would also be able to reduce services to the college, with little or no impact to our students.

Again thank you for the opportunity to express our concerns. We look forward to a continued relationship with MTS as we both strive to effectively serve the citizens of San Diego County.

Metropolitan Transit System

Since moving to El Cajon from Chula Vista 11 years ago, I have been a frequent user of the MTS, including the trolley to downtown San Diego, and buses in San Diego and El Cajon. A conservative estimate would be that I have taken at least 5,000 trips on your system during that time.

In summary, your system is a disaster. I cannot tell from the skimpy details on your Take One whether the proposed changes will improve the situation. Commuting from my home in El Cajon to a part-time job on Fourth Avenue requires the use of two buses and the trolley. It takes an hour and a half to get to work, if the bus/trolley are on time (which they frequently aren't) and two hours to get home. To make sure I'm not late, I leave a half hour early, so that I spend four hours getting to and from a job that is just 15 miles away. For a previous job, it took three buses and a trolley, and an additional hour.

A significant improvement would be to establish an express bus from the El Cajon Transit Center to downtown San Diego. That would shave about an hour from a trolley round trip. Under the current hop-scotch system, every minute counts in making the many transfers from the bus or trolley; if you miss a bus, it's at least half an hour to the next one. Efficiency would be greatly improved if you adopted a common sense procedure (through signage and urging by drivers) of having passengers use the rear exit door so people can get on at the front of the bus. (Passengers in the rear now walk past the exit door, and hold up passengers who are boarding.)

El Cajon Service . . . Lines 815 and 858, which I use almost daily, are frequently 10-20 minutes late. The 815 route, operated by Laidlaw, is identical to the route of the 15 bus, operated by the MTS until September 30, 2001. The 15 was scheduled to take 18-20 minutes from the eastern terminal at Broadway/Main to the ECTC. The 815 is scheduled for 28 minutes, but has a far worse on time record. The 15 at least had an excuse for being late, since it ran for about 90 minutes before arriving in El Cajon. The 815 route is just about 4.5 miles in length. Why has Laidlaw's contract been renewed with such a terrible performance record?

Parkway Plaza . . . Bus service here is very much a disaster area, with four to six buses lined up to pick up passengers at a single stop. The obvious solution is to have one stop for buses going to the ECTC, and another stop for buses coming from the ECTC. Why don't you have schedules posted here? (Schedules were posted at the ECTC a few months ago, after an absence of five or six years.)

Green Line Trolley . . . Schedules were not available in advance for this line and the Orange Line before the Green Line started July 10. The large schedule board at the ECTC was not put up until that morning. Have trolley cars been taken from other lines? I used to take the Orange Line leaving America Plaza with two cars at 9:28 PM; it now leaves at 9:22 with one incredibly packed car.

Schedule Changes . . . In both 2004 and 2005, service was changed at Christmas time to a holiday schedule without adequate advance notice.

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MTS SPEECH

Men and women of the Metropolitan Transit System, transportation is vital in the lives of everyone. The need for work, education, healthcare, and home care revolves around the accessibility of transportation. I am speaking on the behalf of the users of route 833, which runs from Parkway Plaza to the Santee Trolley.

The proposed changes will cause extreme hardship for many.

The proposal to completely stop all bus services over

the weekend would be disastrous!

Several riders of this route have expressed that they will definitely lose their jobs, be unable to continue their education, and be unable to provide food and other necessities for themselves and their families.

Having no bus services on the weekends could very well turn into a life-threatening crisis: it would only be a matter of time.

Using route 833 are many elderly, a couple of wheelchair victims, two blind women, many children and babies, the mentally ill, and the working class. Most of these people will never be able to drive and must rely on the transit system for their lifeline. If they become sick or need food or medicine over the weekend, they will be unable to receive the assistance they need and will suffer accordinglyperhaps with grave consequences.

Allowing buses to move once an hour during the week simply will not work. The early morning rush hour buses are packed. We would not be allowed to board a bus that is dangerously over packed. Many would be late for appointments and late for work and school. Many, including young school aged children will be waiting at dark poorly lit bus stops causing conditions ripe for assault.

The riders of route 833 as well as other routes demand responsible leadership in our community. The men and women of the Metropolitan Transit System have a tremendous responsibility to ensure that the safety and well being of its rider-ship is not sacrificed or hindered. Given this information, we feel confident that the Metropolitan Transit System will make the correct decision.

Re: Proposed Major Changes to Bus Services on Route # 858

As consumers and staff of The Arc of San Diego East County Training Centers, we want to express our concern about proposed bus route changes and cutbacks of bus services.

The Arc's East County Training Center is located at 1374 East Lexington Ave in El Cajon and is currently served by the #858 bus route with the nearest stop being at East Lexington Ave. and Ivory Street. This bus stop is a one half block distance from the Arc center and is very accessible especially for our consumers that use wheelchairs, walkers and canes. This bus stop is an excellent stop for providing reasonable access to Public Transportation under the ADA Americans with Disabilities Act.

According to the new proposals, the Arc East County Training Centers would be served by the #816 and the #874/875 bus route. The nearest proposed stop would be on Jamacha Road for the #816 (one and one half blocks from the Arc Center) and on South Third Street for the #874/875 (three long blocks from the Arc Center). There would be no routes serving East Lexington Ave. between South Third and Jamacha Road and would pose the following safety and reasonable access concerns:

- Jamacha Road is a very busy street and it is quite difficult to cross in a timely manner especially for persons served at the Arc who have mobility and visual impairment challenges.
 - Trying to reach the South Third Ave. Bus Stop provides a significant challenge due to a stretch of walkway that has no sidewalk. It does have a bumpy dirt path that is quite inaccessible for those using wheelchairs. Persons would have to walk in the street for the #874/ #875 bus. This we believe is a significant safety hazard for anyone, especially for persons who have disabilities.

When the #874/#875 comes up Third Street from Melody Lane have it turn right onto Lexington Ave, turn left on Jamacha Road and then turn right on Washington Ave. Going the other way it would go up Washington Ave., turn left on Jamacha Rd., right on Lexington Ave. and then turn left on Third St. on it's way to Melody Lane.

Honorable Board:

I was a part of the Comprehensive Operational Analysis process and I would like to commend Mr. Jablonski, Mr. Cheung and their team for the job they have done to get to this point. As a loud and constant critic of the transit system's shortfalls, I was happy to see the change in approach that was taken on this project.

The three different teams of the COA represented the different interests in the bus system, and each had a say. When soliciting input, the staff didn't just sit back and wait for people to contact them with suggestions. They went out to the bus and trolley stops, set up their presentation and talked to riders as they waited for their bus. They went to extraordinary lengths to get as much input as possible from the every day rider, and I commend them for that. I know that there are still issues that need to be dealt with, and I request that you ask Mr. Jablonski to assure you on the record that this will be an ongoing process, that as each of the kinks are clarified by the riders, they will be looked at and adjustments made where necessary. I will give you three very quick examples. As Mr. Stillwell has informed you, the number 14 bus needs to stop at the Grantville Trolley Station. The number 965 is replacing the number 13, but it is not a full-time bus and so dense, transit dependent neighborhoods are going to be stranded. And the express buses from City Heights to downtown have all been removed, and the travel time for people working downtown has increased dramatically. These are all major problems that can and should be resolved.

Having said that, this is an exciting beginning to a better transit system. Staff are cutting and pruning in these harsh financial times, so that the system can grow back better and stronger once funding begins to flow a little more smoothly. With people like Mr. Jablonski and Mr. Cheung leading the way, the basic groundwork is being set up for a healthier system that is better able to adapt to the demands of the riders.

Please direct Mr. Jablonski to make every effort to resolve the outstanding issues and then move forward with this project.

Minutes from Tierrasanta Community Mtg:

Item 113: MTS Report on Bus Service. Denis Desmond (619-515-0929, denis.desmond@sdmtc.com) discussed the tentative plans Metropolitan Transit System (MTS) has for bus service in Tierrasanta. MTS is completing a Comprehensive Operational Analysis (COA) of the entire system for the first time in about 30 years. MTS must reallocate resources because today it runs a \$50 million annual deficit. They are looking to improve service while reducing the deficit and they expect to achieve this by discontinuing service in areas with very low ridership and by increasing service to areas with higher ridership.

Mr Desmond reports that Tierrasanta's Route 927, which runs hourly (weekdays only), carries an average of about 15-20 riders an hour which is on the low end of ridership but which is still acceptable to retain the service. He reports that the section of 927's route that goes south from Aero Drive to the end of Santo Road and back up results in very few riders (only about 12 per day) and so it seems likely this section of the route will be eliminated.

MTS has met with Director Susan Deininger, former Director Janet Brown and others in the community to better assess the need for service in Tierrasanta. The community representatives have explained that service should be extended along Clairemont Mesa Blvd eastward from La Cuenta because this passes by the Rec Center, several churches and an access to Mission Trails Regional Park. Mr Desmond agreed that adding this to 927 while eliminating the trip down Santo below Aero probably result in a route that still can be cycled every hour (which is the requirement). Mr Desmond said that a new route 927 would probably be put in place a year and data taken at the 6-month and 12-month point to measure ridership.

<u>Motion</u>: (Oates / Hasson) The TCC endorses bus route 927 and advises MTS that this route remains a requirement of the community. The TCC endorses the concept of extending route 927 eastward along Clairemont Mesa Blvd and eliminating the section south of Aero Drive. Passed 14-2-0.

Seeking Response to COA Input

In preparation for the MTS's Comprehensive Operational Analysis workshops, The Mission Valley Unified Planning Committee solicited comments from residents and businesses on ways to improve public transit in Mission Valley. The identified issues were presented at the COA workshops. A few weeks later MTS made changes to transit opportunities in Mission Valley. No suggestions offered by Mission Valley businesses and were enacted. On the contrary, the changes that were made have proven to be counter to the stated goals of MTS.

One of the frustrating aspects of the recent transit changes was MTS's approach of treating Mission Valley solely as a transit corridor for people outside our community. No outreach specifically targeting the businesses or residents of Mission Valley was conducted. The input from the November 4, 2005 meeting at the commuter terminal at Fashion Valley did not represent the concerns of our residents, unlike the community input meetings for other Planning Areas, which targeted residents by holding them in libraries and schools.

Goal for Mission Valley Transit Service

Mission Valley (MV) has begun transitioning from a commercial/retail district into a concentrated mixed urban community with significantly increased residential development—growing almost 42% from April 2000 to January 2005!¹. With the trolley running its length, Mission Valley could be a prime example of integrated transit, second only to Downtown. Like Downtown, Mission Valley's residents are predominantly young and employed. These are people who want to make a

lifestyle choice to use transit-if transit will meet their needs. We all know what those needs are......frequency and convenience.

Is MTS willing at this time to address this big-picture goal? The actions below are steps toward that goal.

Suggestions for Implementation

One of the simplest changes would be to integrate the now sole bus route through the eastern half of the Valley with the trolley and the bus route it terminates with. If the time points for route 14 could be adjusted by 4 minutes, (for example, from 5:55am to 5:59 am), riders could make the trip from Fashion Valley to Kaiser Hospital in about 30 minutes. <u>Currently</u>, it will take a rider nearly 90 minutes for this trip.

The bigger issue is the failure to deliver quarter mile transit opportunities to the vast majority of residents. One of the failures is due to the new cutbacks. The <u>western half of the Valley now has *no transit* service</u> except the trolley which can be <u>more than a half mile</u> from thousands of residents. The Courtyards, 5805 Friars is one of the oldest residential communities in MV. As compared to the balance of the Valley, this area has a significantly older population. The Courtyards is three quarters of a mile from the Morena trolley stop. Not only is there <u>no bus link</u> available to integrate these residents with the trolley, but this area has <u>no transit service</u> within less than a half mile.



The biggest opportunity that is going unrealized in MV is the newly dense employment/school complex, apartment and condominium projects. These include the Escala condominiums on Northside Drive, the River Run Condominiums on River Run Road, and the Art Institute of California and offices in the area of Mission Valley Road. Again, these areas are well outside the MTS's goal of one quarter mile transit support. The inserted diagrams show the guarter mile radius of each trolley station and its relationship to these complexes.

<u>These dense areas need trolley links</u>. The new construction has been undertaken with the stated aim of creating a community served by the trolley. Failure to deliver these links has undermined the success of these communities. For example, smaller shuttle buses linking the Fenton Marketplace trolley stop with the River Run and Escala condominiums as well as the major apartment complexes bordering the condos could bring lifestyle riders into the system. <u>One</u> <u>of the constant requests from this community is for convenient access to the</u> <u>airport</u>.



The Hazard Center Trolley stop is also a critical location for a shuttle. Currently, only the most desperate or brazen person will trolley to Hazard center and then walk to school at the Art Institute or work at one of the many employers in the business park as the crossing at Friars Road is more than 9 lanes wide and the businesses and school are another half mile away.



During the COA meetings, MTS focused its attention on the failed economics of formerly unsuccessful routes and timetables, not to the current needs of MV residents. New routes need to be crafted to serve both lifestyle choice riders and persons who have no options other than public transit. Despite MTA's stated goal to revitalize transit, the actions taken thus far seem to have only addressed an acceptable financial model for a mediocre, subsidized transit system. We have all visited communities with vibrant transit. By your responsiveness Mission Valley can be that example for San Diego. More importantly, Mission Valley at least deserves to realize the promised benefits that were to result from having created dense housing along the trolley.

In closing we ask you, will you respond to this dense and growing segment of more than 17,000 residents? Will you address the specific needs of businesses of the area defined by the City of Villages General Plan as a core Subregional District?² We anticipate your favorable response and look forward to working together toward achieving the MTS goal of quarter mile transit opportunities for residents.

The community of Lakeside and the Lakeside Community Planning Group adamantly opposes any proposal by the Metropolitan Transient System to reduce the level of public transportation available to the citizens of Lakeside. At a minimum the service must be restored to the pre September 2005 level and provide bus service to the urban core of the community.

The proposed changes in bus service presented to the community in January 2006 will have adverse impacts to the environment. The local and regional air quality will be degraded with vehicle emissions produced by the forced increase use of private transportation. This will also place more vehicles on the regions currently overloaded road system.

The citizens have consistently stated a willingness to pay additional taxes to fund public transportation with the passing of Prop A, San Diego County Transportation Improvement Program, in November 2004. Prop A, also known as TRANSNET, includes a Public Transportation component. The voters by supporting Prop A have the expectation of public transportation between their home, place of work and major commercial centers.

For years the land use planning in Lakeside has focused on higher density residential development in the urban core of the community. This included the concentration of higher density senior housing that includes many non-drivers. The elimination of bus service will deprive them of any means of transportation to commercial, recreational and medical centers.

The Lakeside Community Planning Group, on February 2006, passed a motion to deny the Metropolitan Transient System's request for parking restrictions on Main Avenue for bus stops. The motion further stipulated that bus service be retain on Julian Ave., Pino Dr., and Mapleview Dr. to serve the Urban Core of the community. The planning group is not opposed to the realignment of bus routes serving Lakeside as long as the urban core is served and bus service is provided between Lakeside and the Santee Trolley/Commercial Center as well as between Lakeside and the El Cajon Trolley Center. We believe that cost savings can still be made by using the smaller shuttle bus type vehicle for most trips using the larger bus only before and after school to serve the students at Ashwood and Mapleview.

Please keep in mind that when MTS, CTS and NCTS consolidated you assumed the responsibility to provide public transportation to the whole county, not just the metropolitan area.

<u>NEW ROUTINGS</u> -- Calling the new 870 El Cajon/Santee/Kearney Mesa route a Commuter "Express" is a gross misnomer, since it runs from the Santee Transit Center down Mission Gorge Rd., which is a virtual parking lot during rush hours, as is highway 52-west until after 9am on weekdays.

No bus runs on Chambers St., past the Veterans Memorial Hall, home to the VFW, AMVETS, FRA & Marine Corps League, which have many members who are handicapped or have impaired mobility due to their military service, as well as from later incidents after their discharge. The closest that a wheelchair-accessible (or handicapped friendly) bus (815) stops is across the wide merge of El Cajon Bl. and W. Main St. At present, the 871/2 runs on Johnson-Chase & Washington-Marshall, to the Transit Center, and from/to the Mall. A better route would be (872) from the Mall, E. on Madison, S. on Chambers St., then W. on W. Main St. (or El Cajon Bl. and W. on Palm Av.) to the ECTC; or, (871) from the ECTC on W. Main St., north on Chambers, W. on Madison, then N. on Johnson to the Mall. Currently, it appears that virtually no passengers get on or off on Washington or Marshall, or Johnson between Madison & Main. Chambers is also a high density population area. The differences of distances from the current stops of 871/2 at SDG&E and the stops for 815 on W. Main by the Calvary Chapel, are negligible. Transfers between 873 & 871/2 would also be easy -- if intersecting times are adjusted or radio-controlled.

Currently, or planned, there are no bus / shuttle stops at the wheelchair-accessible ramp to the courthouse / ECPAC / City Hall on W. D. Hall Dr. (or on Park Av.). A solution would be to have a small jitney-style vehicle shuttle at or by the 815 stop for the Library / Community Center on Douglas Av. (turn-around in the library / senior housing lot by the library, or in the lot on the N. side of Douglas), on Douglas, Claydelle, E. Main, Ballantyne, W. D. Hall past the access ramp, and back. Running during morning & evening rush hours, and during events at ECPAC,

would be very acceptable.

URRENT & CONTINUING PROBLEMS -- Bus routes in El Cajon don't intersect at convenient times, and radio communication between buses is not permitted in order to coordinate those times. N-S lines cross N-S lines, usually about 5 minutes after the E-W route has gone by (and vice versa). A perfect example is trying to get from Alpine to downtown El Cajon, on a weekend, when buses run only every hour. The 864 from Alpine gets to the intersection with the 815 going to downtown, on Broadway at E. Main St., after the 815 has left, and the wait is 45 minutes or more for the next 815 to come by.

The 871 in El Cajon, going S. on Ballantyne, crosses Madison Ave. just after the 873 Madison Ave. Shuttle (west-bound) passes. Again, weekends are the worst example with the approximately 1-hour wait. The same is true for 848/864-871/2 connection.

Especially on weekends, the 848 from Lakeside and the 864 get to the transit center in El Cajon after all other buses have left, with only the half-hourly downtown shuttles, 871 & 872, available during the next hour. You can't even get downtown on the 815; 871/2 stop annoyingly far from the downtown center, and calling them "downtown" shuttles is a joke.

Calling the operator of the 800-series buses, Laidlaw in El Cajon, is an exercise in frustrating recorded messages and having to choose which number to push from the given menu of choices (none apparently referring to your problem), which then has whomever answers finally tell you that they don't know what to tell you, because all scheduling and other services or information are provided from San Diego (233-3004).

Publishing route adjustments for the Mother Goose Parade, or other route-impairing events, ahead of time, would be very helpful.

Exact change is always required to board any 5xx, MTS, CTS or NCTD bus, for the desired destination, and transfers <u>must</u> be picked up when boarding. A Trolley ticket serves as a Transfer, as well.

There are no special fare rates on 5xx routes, for senior/disabled, youth, college, day-tripper and monthly passes. Children <u>under</u> age 6 ride free & ages 6 through 14 (ID required) pay a basic \$1.00, except for the 50ϕ or 75ϕ shuttle fees, and must be accompanied by a full fare-paying adult.

Costs of trips, including on the MTS buses & the Trolley, are determined by sequentially adding the individual point-to-point costs. Cost indicators in red are 50ϕ fixed-costs that are always added [except, not for one 75¢ shuttle fee shown]. All others are regular-cost, and after the first two of those, all the rest following are reduced by 50ϕ . When more than one overall route sequence to the same destination is available, the cost is always computed by the cheapest fare, regardless of which choice, or route sequence, is made or used; destination is what counts.

When initially boarding a bus, or the Trolley, for connection to a 5xx route, the regular fare is paid, and a Transfer ticket must be picked up (the Trolley ticket is used as a Transfer). The fare paid to get the Transfer ticket will then count as the first of two full-fare costs on the 5xx bus. When returning, use a Transfer ticket from the 5xx bus to change to a final destination on an MTS or NCTD bus, with no additional cost.

Example: When going to the WAP from DT, MTS-7 is \$2.25; the regular cost of BP to WAP is \$5.00, and less a \$1.00 discount for the MTS-7, with the Transfer you would pay the 503 bus driver \$4.00 at BP, for a total out-of-pocket \$6.25. If you drove your own vehicle, the parking cost at the WAP alone is \$6.00. On the return trip, with the Transfer ticket from the 5xx buses, the MTS-7 to Downtown is in the initial \$6.25 to be paid at the WAP to get DT. Your Destination ticket serves as a Transfer between 5xx routes.

Destination tickets are purchased when boarding a 5xx bus, and must be returned when getting off the bus at that destination, to prove that payment was made to that point. Red cost-indicated routes are treated like shuttles. When going any one stop indicated, a Shuttle ticket, instead of a Destination ticket, will be given.

Re- Proposed Route Changes for the Southern Area

To the MTS Board of Directors:

On 8 March 1983, my vehicle was broadsided by an underage drinker after he ran a stop sign in his lifted 4x4 pickup. This resulted in the death of my 3 ½ year-old son, numerous injuries to my wife, and my near death. I was comatose for 62 days, suffered numerous severe injuries and am now permanently physically handicapped and my speech was badly damaged due to the closed head injury I got. I only tell you this so you'll know of my background and be aware of the importance of public transit to many people when you make your decisions on the fate of the Chula Vista Transit buses routes. I am writing this letter to you in lieu of speaking hearing at your public hearing at Golden Hall, as I'm not able to be clearly understood when I speak. So I'm presenting my opinions to you in writing and ask that they be seriously considered in making your final decisions.

On 21 November 2005, I wrote a letter to Leon Williams, Chairman of the MTS Board of directors, a copy of which I've enclosed. I had written to Mr. Williams after attending the Community Meeting for Comprehensive Operational Analysis (COA) at the 24th Street trolley station to express my frustration at the conduct of that meeting. It was at this meeting that I first learned of COA's intentions to change service on Chula Vista Transit (CVT) and elimination of the route that runs closest to my house, CVT 707, and the re-routing of the next closest one, CVT 704, off of Telegraph Canyon Road. I told him that these proposed changes would require me to walk all the way up to East "H" Street to catch the next closest route, CVT 709. I am handicapped but have recovered enough to be able to walk, though it is with much difficulty. Walking from my house down to the CVT 707 bus stop on Paseo Ladera at Paseo Entrada, or even down to the CVT 704 bus stop down on Telegraph Canyon Road at Paseo Ladera, is not too difficult, as they're both within ½ a mile away from my house. But having to walk all the way up to East "H" Street, a distance of 2 miles going up and down hills, is ridiculous.

Recently, I picked up a flyer on a CVT bus which outlined the proposed route changes for the Southern Area. The current routing of the CVT 707 would be eliminated and it would become the "Eastlake Circulator", which covers an area already currently served by CVT 709. The time frequency would remain at 60 minutes. Why does this need to be done? If the current CVT routings remain, there would be no need for this. Plus, the proposed time frequencies for the CVT routes 701, 709, and 712 would require at least four more buses to be in operation. The whole idea of the COA was supposed to be to increase rider service while reducing operating costs.

I no longer am able to drive; luckily, I've got my monthly MTS pass and still have access to the entire MTS system, which allows me to go to many regions of San Diego County. But the proposed changes will deny me this access. As I told Mr. Williams in my letter, the acronym COA would effectively mean <u>Cutting Off Access to myself</u>, seniors, and other transit dependent people of Chula Vista, as well as in the entire County of San Diego. Please do <u>not</u> allow this to happen- maintain the current routing of the CVT 707 and the CVT 704. Thank you.

Dear Mr. Williams:

I attended the Community Meeting for Comprehensive Operational Analysis (COA) at the 24th Street trolley station on Friday, 18 November 2005 to express my opinions on the plans being proposed for bus service out of that station. A friend of mine, a driver on National City Transit (NCT), had asked me to go and give them the opinions of a frequent NCT rider. I had seen a map earlier that week of the changes that were being proposed for National City at the 24th Street trolley station. Though I live in Chula Vista and am a more frequent rider of Chula Vista Transit (CVT), I hadn't seen any map discussing proposed changes to CVT at the "H" Street station, so I thought it was going to be unaffected by COA.

When I arrived at the 24th Street trolley station, I was expecting a forum where several officials of the MTS, NCT, and the City would be there to hear the comments of concerned citizens and NCT riders. Instead, what I found was an unorganized gaggle of people venting their opinions to the few MTS personnel available to try and explain the proposed changes. I had typed up a list of the questions I intended to address (a copy of which I've enclosed) at the forum I had been expecting. But when I saw how the "meeting" was going, I attempted to discuss these concerns with the few MTS people there. This was a frustrating experience for me because it was very noisy and I could not be understood by most of the MTS people there, due to the speech damage I have as a result of an auto accident. However, one of them, Mike D., was very patient and helpful to me; he gave me your name and address when I asked him if there was someone I could write to and express my concerns about COA.

After talking with Mike, I went over to look at the board that showed the entire MTS system route map as it would be should the COA proposals be approved. I was absolutely shocked- the COA would completely eliminate CVT Route 707, the closest route to my house. To add insult to injury, the COA would reroute Route 704, the next closest CVT route, off of Telegraph Canyon Road. This would mean that the closest route to my house would require a walk of nearly **two** miles up to East "H" Street to catch CVT Route 709! Why didn't

CVT put up a map of the proposed Chula Vista changes at the "H" Street trolley station, as NCT had done for National City at the 24^{th} Street trolley station? This is totally unacceptable. Route 707 should not be eliminated; the bus is usually at least $\frac{1}{2}$ full and it serves residences along its route out to Sharp Hospital, as well as serving Terra Nova Plaza and other businesses along East "H" Street. As for the rerouting of the 704, why don't they keep it on the old route? Implementing the changes proposed by COA would severely reduce the system's coverage of the City of Chula Vista. The purpose of public transit is to provide service to those who may not have access to it otherwise. Looking at the proposed changes COA would bring about, a more accurate use of the acronym COA would be <u>Cutting Off Access</u> because that's exactly what it would do to myself, other disabled people, seniors, and other passengers.

I am handicapped as a result of my car being broadsided by an underage drinker, in his lifted 4x4 pickup, after he ran a stop sign back in March 1983. My 3 ½ year old son was killed, I suffered a severe closed head injury, was comatose (for 62 days), and was nearly killed myself. I will never be able to work nor drive again; but with the Lord's help, I have recovered enough to be able to walk on my own, though it is with difficulty due to a bad sense of balance caused by my injuries. I have had a Senior/Disabled monthly transit pass since they first came out in 1988, like both its savings and convenience, and enjoy the independence it allows me to go all over the County on the various MTS trolley and bus routes.

The main purpose of this letter is to express my opposition to the proposed changes that COA would bring about. I know that I am only one person, but I also know that my opinions are shared by many other disabled and senior MTS passengers who may not have the time or capability to be able to address them to you. I'm originally from Hartford, CT, went to college in Boston, and came out here to serve as a Marine Corps officer at Camp Pendleton. I immediately fell in love with San Diego, met my wife out here, and settled in Chula Vista once I got off of active duty with the Marines in 1980. I want you to know that San Diego's transit system is miles ahead of the many systems I've encountered along the East Coast. I would appreciate your response to the points I've made, but realize you may not have enough time to address them. Thank you for taking the time to read my opinions and thank you especially for your positive contributions to the MTS.

Questions about the Comprehensive Operational Analysis (COA) effects on National City Transit (NCT)

18 November 2005

- My name is Andrew Delgado and I live in Chula Vista; I am now handicapped and haven't driven for over 22 years. I have a monthly disabled pass and have ridden on NCT at least three times a week for the past 18 years and have always enjoyed good service. There's a decal on the side of each bus talking of an annual award NCT has twice received for safe service. Looking at the map showing the proposed changes, they would completely wipe NCT out of existence if approved. For what reason?

- The flyer showing the meeting time, taken from the trolley, showed the wrong date and time. I was told this when I showed the flyer to an NCT driver, who said the date was wrong. In the usual "CYA" (Cover Your Ass) method used by government agencies, the flyer said, "Locations dates and times are subject to change." Then it gave a telephone number to call or a website address to log onto to check for any changes. So I went online to the MTS website last week to see if the change had been noted. The website did show the new date, but it showed an incorrect time of 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. (as of 10:00 this morning, the website did show the correct time); only after looking at the display at the 24h Street trolley station did I learn correct time. How many of NCT's passengers have the time to check out the meeting time/date via phone or have access to a computer to check it online? It seems to me as if the powers-to-be have intentionally moved the date in hopes that attendance would be lessened at this meeting.

- Have you discussed these proposed changes with the unions that represent the drivers and the mechanics, telling them what its effect are on their members? What's going to happen to the fairly new NCT rolling stock and the equally new maintenance facility if these changes go through?

- What's the harm in keeping the NCT rolling stock and employees as they currently are? The phrase, "if it ain't broke, don't fix it", should apply here. Are the new bus routes going to continue the same level of service?

Dear Metropolitan Transit System:

I am writing to respond to several service changes being proposed as a result of the recently conducted Comprehensive Operational Analysis. I find many of the proposals to be beneficial to the public, and I applaud MTS for planning these changes. Some of the highlights include the re-routing of routes 712, 929, and 992, as well as the creation of routes 10L, 15L, and 120L.

However, I am concerned about the restructuring of several routes in the City of Chula Vista. My concerns are addressed on a route-by-route basis below:

701: Service should operate via Second Avenue between F and H Streets, not Third Avenue. Third Avenue already has frequent bus service, Second Avenue services a residential area that has had bus service for more than 30 years, and the westbound stop at F & 3^{rd} would have to be relocated to a congested location.

703: The cancellation of this route leaves the shopping center at Crest Drive and Telegraph Canyon Road and the J Street residential corridor without service. The elimination of route 702 in the vicinity of J Street will increase demand for this route, which already operates at a 30-minute frequency weekdays.

705/713: Route 705 should not be split into two routes. This will force passengers to make an unnecessary transfer between buses at Plaza Bonita. Route 713 should operate during the day, not just during peak periods. Route 713 will be the only bus service in the community of Bonita with the elimination of route 711, increasing the demand for this route.

706: I am very concerned about the cancellation of this route. Route 706 is an important circulator connecting several senior housing complexes with local shopping areas, the Civic Center, downtown, and H Street Trolley Station. At the very minimum this route should be left as is. Ideally service would be improved by providing a counterclockwise companion to this route, similar to the also cancelled route 706A. This is a very popular route with seniors, and with its elimination there will be no reasonable alternative for this transit-dependent population.

709: This route should continue to serve Eastlake Parkway at Otay Lakes Road. This intersection is a local generator with several important shopping destinations for the east side of town.

As a transportation planner, public transit advocate, long-time transit user, and native of the San Diego area, a few other routing issues have come to my attention. Briefly, they are:

Route 854 should continue to serve Santee Town Center, as this provides an important connection between Grossmont College and Santee. Routes 916 and 917 should serve Massachusetts Avenue Trolley Station, which is located just a couple blocks from the proposed routes. The Orange Line Trolley should terminate at El Cajon Transit Center, as there is no justification for continuing service to Gillespie Field when service is being cut on much busier bus lines. Lastly, University Towne Centre should remain the primary transit stop in the Golden Triangle. While the transit center itself has no room for expansion, a high level of service must remain at this regional generator.

Please take time to understand the implications of the changes proposed in the COA, and how the changes will affect transit-dependent and choice-transit users. I am concerned that the MTS board will choose to gut local bus service much like it did with the rural bus service a few months ago, and I would like my concern to be unjustified. San Diego is a growing city, and with growth comes increased travel demand that justifies additional transit service, not service reductions.

Dear Sirs,

I wish to give you my comments regarding your proposed changes of bus routes in the forthcoming months as given in your posted notice of 2-10-06. Namely, my greatest concern is the route # 908 which currently serves the Old Town- City Heights area.

In your posted notice of 2-10-06 with the proposed revised map and route listing, you have eliminated # 908 from your service. I feel very strongly that this elimination of 908 will be a severe, if not catastrophic hardship for those individuals with physical and/or mental disabilities and whose only means of transportation are the MTS buses and trolley system.

You will note that within the present 908 service area, the US Post office is located on Midway roughly between Rosecrans St. and Barnett Ave. Should the 908 be eliminated, persons with heart conditions, severe high blood pressure, mobility limitations and under strict psychotropic protocols would be forced to get off at Midway and Rosecrans and then travel over half a mile to the Post Office. While such a "walk" would hardly be more than an inconvenience to the "normal" person of health, such a distance would be virtually impossible for those of us with severe health and physical limitations. Consider also the fact that homeless persons within the "central area" must go to the Post Office on Midway to collect their general delivery mail and so forth. At this time, the US Postal Service refuse to make the downtown Post Office, located on 9th and E St., a general delivery for the homeless in the downtown area and insist that all general delivery, which includes Hillcrest, North Park, City Heights, Barrio Logan and the South Park regions, be made at the Post Office on Midway. This imposes a severe hardship on those persons who must live on the streets to survive and who also have severe disabilities.

I will use myself as an example. I have muscular-dystrophy which has not only confined me to a wheelchair but which also prohibits me to travel for more than a hundred yards per 10 minutes on the level or for more than 10 minutes duration within a 2 hour period. Being single and without the help of relatives and friends, I must assess all necessities of daily life on my own and I take great pride in my self-reliance and independence, yet should I be forced to exceed the limitations of my medical condition, it would be absolutely devastating for my independence. Indeed, my basic survival would be at jeopardy. Such an occurrence would place me in an institution at public expense and thus impose another tax burden upon the public. There is no doubt that there are many others having severe limitations as I do and the proposed elimination of 908 would be utterly disastrous for us. Like I said, if the US Postal people would be so kind as to open the 9th. St. Post Office for general delivery, I would not object to the cessation of 908 (but I would not be speaking for those disabled who must assess the Midway Post Office otherwise).

Incidentally, the 908 also serves the Marine Corp Recruit Depot on Pacific hwy and Witherby St., surely you need to keep that bus stop operational as it is a very important point of stop for a great many people.

All in all, I support your effort to be proactive and thrifty with the MTS system. I only ask you to reconsider your plan to eliminate route #908.

I thank you for your consideration in this matter.

The community of Lakeside and the Lakeside Community Planning Group adamantly opposes any proposal by the Metropolitan Transient System to reduce the level of public transportation available to the citizens of Lakeside. At a minimum the service must be restored to the pre September 2005 level and provide bus service to the urban core of the community.

The proposed changes in bus service presented to the community in January 2006 will have adverse impacts to the environment. The local and regional air quality will be degraded with vehicle emissions produced by the forced increase use of private transportation. This will also place more vehicles on the regions currently overloaded road system.

The citizens have consistently stated a willingness to pay additional taxes to fund public transportation with the passing of Prop A, San Diego County Transportation Improvement Program, in November 2004. Prop A, also known as TRANSNET, includes a Public Transportation component. The voters by supporting Prop A have the expectation of public transportation between their home, place of work and major commercial centers.

For years the land use planning in Lakeside has focused on higher density residential development in the urban core of the community. This included the concentration of higher density senior housing that includes many non-drivers. The elimination of bus service will deprive them of any means of transportation to commercial, recreational and medical centers.

The Lakeside Community Planning Group, on February 2006, passed a motion to deny the Metropolitan Transient System's request for parking restrictions on Main Avenue for bus stops. The motion further stipulated that bus service be retain on Julian Ave., Pino Dr., and Mapleview Dr. to serve the Urban Core of the community. Subject: The Metropolitan Transit System Comprehensive Operational Analysis Proposal for Lakeside, March 2, 2006, page 2

The planning group is not opposed to the realignment of bus routes serving Lakeside as long as the urban core is served and bus service is provided between Lakeside and the Santee Trolley/Commercial Center as well as between Lakeside and the El Cajon Trolley Center. We believe that cost savings can still be made by using the smaller shuttle bus type vehicle for most trips using the larger bus only before and after school to serve the students at Ashwood and Mapleview.

Please keep in mind that when MTS, CTS and NCTS consolidated you assumed the responsibility to provide public transportation to the whole county, not just the metropolitan area.

Dear Chairman Mathis:

On behalf of the residents of La Jolla we wish to express our objection to the proposed reduction in bus service to and from our community in the MTS COA Service Development Plan. The proposed combined Route 30 and Route 34 will have a bus frequency of every 15 minutes. This is a 45% reduction in the number of busses to and from La Jolla in the southerly direction (to Pacific Beach) and a 15% reduction in the northerly direction (to the University Community).

The Trustees of the La Jolla Town Council at their December meeting passed the following resolution. It asks that MTS maintain the present frequency of bus service in the northerly direction and accepts a reduction of 35% for bus trips to and from the south:

Minimum acceptable service is busses at least every 12½ minutes (average over the day) going each way (north and south) from La Jolla.

We believe bus service through our community should be improved and not reduced to provide the necessary alternative means of transportation that can alleviate our traffic and parking problems. Routes 30 and 34 are well used now, and their riders should not be discouraged by longer waits and longer ride times.

On February 16, 2006 the Serra Mesa Planning Group voted unanimously to present our concerns to MTS regarding the bus routes affecting Serra Mesa. At the March 2 COA hearing I made a presentation and left a packet for you.

As our assessment in the packet shows there are a significant number of people living in the area of Mission Village Drive who are Easy Goers and Road Runners, the target population for transit users. Given the above assessment Route 927 along Mission Village Drive should have been successful. So why wasn't it? There could be any number of reasons. Marketing of this new route, 927, was minimal. The route did not meet the needs of people.

A review of the bus routes in other areas of the City indicates that coverage is being provided along the major streets of communities, even in areas that have fewer Easy Goers and Road Runners than Mission Village Drive.

The current and proposed bus routes have neglected potential customers and an important segment of our population – the youth. Mission Valley has no schools and none are proposed. The children who live in the eastern part of Mission Valley go to Juarez Elementary and Taft Middle School. Since the school district does not provide bus service families must provide transportation. We have children walking over 1 ½ miles up a steep hill, Coryell Pass, with heavy backpacks.

Serra Mesa's high school is Kearny. The students that live near Mission Village Drive have no public bus service. Students living near Aero Drive can catch Route 25, exit near Health Center Road, and walk to Kearny. Discontinuing service on Aero Drive between Kearny Villa and Ruffin Roads is being proposed. If the proposed routes are implemented, none of the students from Serra Mesa will be able to easily travel in a timely manner to Kearny using mass transit. This is also true for Serra Mesa residents who use the 25 to access medical services or other City services (e.g., the Kearny Mesa Swimming Pool). We do not have a pool in Serra Mesa.

Additionally, there is a mixed-use project that will be built at the corner of Kearny Villa and Aero Drive and a proposal for a mixed-use development on Aero Drive. Since Aero Drive is being redeveloped removing 25 is short sighted. Rather than removing the route why not discontinue service during the time when ridership is the lowest (e.g., evening)?

We look forward to your answers for the following questions: Why wasn't any Serra Mesa community group informed prior to the discontinuation of Route 927 along Mission Village Drive? What are the reasons for not considering a bus route along Mission Village Drive (given there's significant target population)? What are the reasons for discontinuing service along Kearny Villa and Aero Drive (given the projected growth and the current needs of residents)?

We hope you will send the routes affecting Serra Mesa back to the drawing board to be reworked. Working with the community could create mutually beneficial routes.

Dear MTS:

I would like to provide public comment about the proposed MTS service changes. This includes a proposed alternative to your plans to eliminate the 854 route through Santee and Lakeside along with support for your Northern Area reorganization.

Since the nearest Route 848 stop is approximately the same distance from my home as the nearest Route 854 stop, the elimination of the 854 line will hurt the State Assembly campaign of Santee's SANDAG representative, who talks about promoting smart growth but will have eliminated the only bus route serving the Woodside Avenue industrial area of Santee, more than it will hurt me. The 848 line does not run as late as the 854, but extension of the 848 hours can rectify that situation.

Since the 854 runs alternate clockwise and counterclockwise loops, it essentially runs twice every two hours through Lakeside rather than once an hour. When MTS cut the service last September from every hour to every two hours I suggested eliminating the 854 line past the trolley station altogether and serving Lakeside with a FAST bus as is the case in Fallbrook and Ramona. The 848 fixed-line route would still provide for bus service to El Capitan High School, just as the 306 line passes Fallbrook High School before Fallbrook's FAST system takes over. The concept of SANDAG taking over planning of MTS and NCTD was to create a coordinated system, so it's time for MTS to have FAST service as is the case in NCTD's major unincorporated Since I have proposed replacing the fixed-line communities. route with FAST service, I believe that the MTS plans to eliminate the 854 line have merit in conjunction with implementing the alternative.

A FAST bus for Lakeside would also eliminate the possibility of lawsuits challenging the sufficiency of the environmental Negative Declaration as well as breach of contract lawsuits. If eliminating bus service along the 854 line forces riders to obtain cars, they will likely obtain the least expensive used cars which are less effective at reducing automotive pollution and noise emissions. Therefore while the cumulative traffic impact of forcing the 854 riders to use cars may be minimal, the pollution and noise impacts would likely be more substantial than a Negative Declaration would allow and the sufficiency of the MTS environmental impact statement on the cuts could face a legal challenge. Furthermore, when the County of San Diego divested its County Transit System to MTS in 2002 one of the conditions was that MTS would maintain its level of service in the CTS area. The elimination of the 854 route violates the terms of the conditions of the transfer of service and therefore may invalidate the resolution of transfer or alternately may cause a judge in a court challenge to rule that MTS must restore the 854 line which would involve the expense of MTS legal fees and possibly also an award of prevailing party legal costs. A FAST bus which retains the level of service to Lakeside and the Woodside Avenue area of Santee would protect MTS from the legal challenges associated with forcing 854 riders into cars and cutting the service previously provided by CTS.

It should also be noted that the upcoming Compass Card program may significantly restructure farebox recovery rates. I cannot purchase a Day Tripper on a Lakeside bus; I can purchase one in advance at certain transit stations or at the Transit Store in Downtown San Diego or I can purchase one starting that day at any trolley station. If I purchase a one-way fare on a Lakeside bus I cannot upgrade to a Day Tripper, so I save that fare by purchasing a day tripper in advance in the City of San Diego. If the Compass Card allows Lakeside users to purchase Day Trippers on a Lakeside bus, the fare recovery ratio will likely be higher.

As for the restructuring of the 848 line, I concur with those changes. The elimination of service to Our Lady of Perpetual Help would not be a problem, since OLPH's St. Joseph's Ministry provides rides for parishioners without their own transportation, although I do not know whether Mapleview Baptist Church has a similar program.

I am in support of the elimination of Route 34 in the northern service area. I conduct a significant amount of library research at UCSD, where there is about as much free public parking as there is on the polar icecap, and I frequently use the north-south lines to and from UCSD. Increasing the frequency of Route 41 to every 15 minutes is an extremely positive step, while increasing the frequency of Route 30 to every 15 minutes and adding Saturday service not only replaces the Route 34 service but also increases frequency of the trip from Downtown San Diego to UCSD. Meanwhile the trip from Old Town to UCSD involves an extra transfer, but since the 8/9 loop runs every 15 minutes and possibly twice every 15 minutes since one can reach the Route 30 connection point from either direction service is not adversely affected and is in fact increased to some of the beach areas. Route 34 is one of many buses which go from University Town Center to UCSD, but with 15minute frequency of both Route 30 and Route 41 service between UTC and UCSD will actually be increased.

I hope that MTS will consider the alternative to outright elimination of the 854 line service and will implement the Northern Area changes.

Attn: To whom it may concern Proposed change to Route 850 from North County to Downtown San Diego

I understand that the proposed change to Route 850 will eliminate all Rancho Bernardo stops and will come North on 115 getting off at the Carmel Mountain exit. I also know that you want to eliminate stops at Penesquitos Drive /Carmel Mountain and the Cuca stops, making the first stop Stoney Creek. Stoney Creek is not a secure parking lot, it is not completely visible from the street and we feel that there is a chance that we could experience the same car damage that riders parking at the Freeport park and ride experienced. They suffered damage on most of their vchicles from what we believe were the young kids at the skate park across the street. The damage suffered were taillights, headlights and windshields broken, all of the costs were borne by the bus riders. The police were called but told us that unless they see the perpetrators they could not do anything.

The route will still come down Carmel Mountain Road so there is no mileage savings and the stopping time is merely a few minutes total. What is the reason for not stopping at the Penesquitos Drive and Cuca, you have approx. 7-9 passengers that get on at these stops.

Currently the first stop is at the Penesquitos & Carmel Mountain Road it stops across from the Albertson's grocery store. This stop usually has from 4-6 riders; some have been riding for years on the same bus. I am the only one that drives (approx. 1.5 miles) to this location all of the others walk from their houses.

I am concerned that the Commuter Bus Route 850 will eliminate stopping at our present stop if the new proposal route changes goes through. If you eliminate this stop and the one at Cuca making the first stop Stoney Creek, this will be a hardship to us and the 3 people that always get on at Cuca. The riders at the Cuca stop also walk to the bus stop, so I am still the only driver on these two stops.

If you eliminate these two stops you will cause a hardship to all 7-9 of us and then all of us will have to drive to the Stoney Creek location. None of us are pleased with location and leaving our cars there for the entire day. Keep in mind that all of the other passengers except me can walk to the first two stops. They will all now have to drive to a more distant location.

I will not be able to go to any of the public hearings; however, I hope that this letter will be entered into the record as a concern from all of us.

I just read your Important Notice! Yesterday! The front of the notice indicates a "Post" date of 2/10/06 – 3/10/06. I can tell you that it was not posted on the bus until last week.

I have been taking the bus on and off since I was 8 years old (some 52 years) and have had to rely solely on the bus service since 1990. I have seen many changes over the years, some of them good; but, unfortunately, most of those changes appear to have been made, dare I say, with the same care and thought as monkeys throwing darts.

I realize that those of you in the system that determine the bus routes, time schedules and the like, don't have to rely upon the bus for transportation, and it is quite apparent. If you had to, you would never make those decisions so arbitrarily.

For about four years I worked at a building located on Camino Del Rio South, just east of Texas Street. If my job was still located there, I would be completely out of luck getting to work, as a result of the change you made discontinuing the Route 81 bus. How would you suggest people get to the building from the trolley – not only people in good health, but those that have disabilities and rely solely on the bus to go to their doctor, dentist, and even the grocery store? And what about those seniors and others that live on Friar's Road between Old Town and Fashion Valley and, again, rely solely on public transportation? You cut out all bus service on Friar's Road.

Your previous changes made to the Route 27 have made it very difficult for many riders that now have to plan on an extra half hour to an hour to get to work because you now have them going well out of their way and add another bus route just so they <u>can</u> work.

You seem to be catering to those people with money that can afford a monthly bus pass outlay at one time, when those that really need to take the bus because they don't have transportation or can't afford that initial transportation outlay, have to get transfers that run out even before they get to their destination. I find that deplorable.

I am either working and/or riding a bus when you have scheduled these "public meetings". **Shame on you!** It is my fervent hope that many more people write to you, voicing their concern as well, and more...that you FIX IT.

You profess to want to increase your rider ship; you increase the trolley system but take away from the most important part – the bus system that takes you to the trolley.

RE: Proposed Changes to Route 30

I am <u>against the proposed changes to Route 30</u>, which would divert the route through the Old Town Transit Center. I have ridden Route 30 consistently since 1978 when I began working downtown. Route 30 has always been noted for erratic and unreliable service. Over the past 27 years, I have wasted hundreds of hours waiting for the 30 buses that did not come when they were supposed to. I also take a number of the other bus routes, and the 30 is by far the worst. The Route 50, for example, over the years has a far superior on-time record and often uses larger buses, even though the 50 usually has fewer passengers than the 30. The Route 30 has suffered from less competent drivers and smaller buses, even though it is a popular route with tourists, office workers, and many others. I have written and called San Diego Transit occasionally about the chronic lateness of Route 30, but the situation has never improved. There are some conscientious drivers on Route 30 who reasonably keep on schedule, but many of the drivers are habitually late no matter how light the traffic is. "No shows" and lateness of 10 to 30 minutes are common on Route 30.

I believe the proposal to make Route 30 into more of a local instead of an express route, by diverting it to Pacific Highway and Old Town, will worsen the already poor service. Routes 9 and 34 no longer come downtown, so the proposal will further curtail service to Pacific Beach and La Jolla.

In writing you, I represent several hundred bus riders with huge concern about the chopping up and dissolution of Route 856 and complete dismay over proposed Route 962. I have been an MTS rider for five years and speak of the following with great knowledge.

Route 856

This route is the heavily traveled backbone of Spring Valley to Rancho San Diego and Cuyamaca College on one end to businesses in Lemon Grove and the trolley.

- 1. Its length is heavily traveled by employees and patrons of Rancho San Diego Town Center businesses who expect easy, smooth access to their facilities.
- 2. It is the major artery for students to Cuyamaca College and two local high schools whose parents do not want transfers for their children to go to school..
- 3. It is used by residents to get to shopping areas with the low, kneeling Route 856 buses.
- 4. It is used by all for smooth movement within the community.

To chop this highly used, efficient and dependable 10 mile route into 3 segments with two transfers, as proposed, makes no sense. It imposes stress and hardship on all riders, headaches for drivers with an overabundance of transfers, and timing and coordination problems on a now smooth, highly used, efficient route.

In the proposed route replacement, people who caught the 936B would travel 2 miles to Orville Street (Spring Valley Shopping Center), transfer to Route 962 for 5 miles, then transfer to Route 855 for the last 3 miles to Rancho San Diego Town Center—three short bus trips and two transfers for a ten mile trip—and then repeat the process on their return. This is not good MTS planning nor good service to the people of Spring Valley. The best solution is already in place—Route 856. Please leave it in tact.

Proposed Route 962

This route from the 8th Street Trolley Station to Rancho San Diego Village is ridiculous.

- 1. It is too long.
- 2. It disrupts Spring Valley-Rancho San Diego travel.
- 3. It is not needed as no one travels from Rancho San Diego to the 8th Street trolley station nor vice versa.
- 4. It connects by Spring Valley by direct link to the gang-infested, high crime area of Meadow Brook and Paradise Valley. Spring Valley has enough problems without MTS adding to it.
- 5. It poses problems for Spring Valley law enforcement already stressed with a small part-time sheriff's sub-station.
- 6. It opens the Spring Valley Shopping Center transfer area to crime and danger to riders and residents.
- 7. It creates a nightmare of coordination and transfers in Spring Valley for both riders and drivers.

Proposed Route 962 may look good to planners on paper, but it is not. It is impractical because of its lack of need and its disruption to Spring Valley/ Rancho San Diego travel. There is a better use of tax payer dollars.

You say you are proposing major changes to the bus services to "increase ridership," but everything I see in your Central and North Area maps looks like a reduction in service. How do you propose to increase ridership by cutting and shortening so many routes?

Some of your proposed changes that really bother us include:

- Old Poway Park: it looks like we can no longer take Route 844 to get there on the weekends. That is totally unacceptable.
- Maine Corp Air Station Miramar: They have a museum we would like to visit, but Route 20 will no longer stop at the North Gate.
- Del Mar Fair Grounds: Don't see Route 101 coming into UTC. How are we supposed to get to the fair?

We live near the intersection of Balboa and Genesee Avenues. If you really want to increase ridership, here are some things you can do to help us:

Notice is hereby given that the Metropolitan Transit System (MTS) will conduct public hearings on March 2, 2006, at 6:00 pm at Golden Hall (San Diego Concourse, 202 C Street, San Diego, CA 92101), on March 8, 2006 at 6:00 pm at the German American Hall (1017 S. Mollison Ave., El Cajon, CA 92020) and on March 9, 2006 at 9:00 a.m. at Golden Hall. The purpose of the public hearings is to consider and approve proposed changes to MTS bus and Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) paratransit services, which include routes operated by San Diego Transit Corporation, MTS Contract Services, National City Transit, Chula Vista Transit, MTS Access, and MTS Suburban Paratransit.

If approved, the proposals would be implemented starting June 2006.
