



## Work Plan Guidelines for MTS Right of Entry (ROE) Permit

MTS requires most applicants/permittees for an ROE permit to submit a narrative work plan along with their construction documents. This work plan should cover all phases of construction that will impact or have the potential to impact MTS facilities, infrastructure, fee-owned land, bus stops, stations, railroad crossings, bus operations, and trolley operations. Projects that impact North County Transit District (NCTD) railroad operations or San Diego & Imperial Valley Railroad (SDIV) freight train operations should also state those impacts. The guidelines listed below outline the information that should be included in the work plan. Note that extended trolley/bus shutdowns to accommodate construction activities generally are not granted unless no reasonable alternatives exist.
